Dear Parents and Carers

As we approach the end of the year there are some items to share with you.

Firstly we would like to announce our amazing results. We have not had the final National expectations for Year 2 yet to compare our results to. However, Year 6 exceeded National outcomes for expected standards in Reading, Writing and Maths and at greater depth in reading:

- Early Years - 74% of our pupils achieving their Early Learning Goals (72% last year).
- 89% of pupils (Year 1) passed their phonics screening check.
- Year 2 - 84% achieving the expected standard (or better) in reading. 22% achieved greater depth.
 - 84% achieved expected standard (or better) in writing. 22% achieved greater depth.
 - 82% achieving expected (or better) in maths. 20% achieved greater depth.
- Year 6 - 89% achieved expected (or better) for reading. 36% achieved greater depth.
 - 81% achieved expected (or better) for writing. 8% achieved greater depth.
 - 86% of pupils achieved expected (or better) for maths. 19% achieved greater depth.
- Our most impressive outcome were the number of pupils in Year 6 who achieved the expected standard in all three subjects (reading, writing and maths) – with 78% of our pupils meeting this level (compared with 59% of pupils in Cambridgeshire).

On a very different matter, we have heard the news today that the mobile classrooms due to be with us in September have not, yet, received planning permission. Alternative plans have therefore been put in place to ensure good provision for pupils until planning is granted. Children will discover, therefore, when they return in the Autumn that their classroom is not where it was on move-up day! Class changes:

- Mrs Munro-Wilkinson, teaching Year 1, will be located in one of the classes currently occupied by Mrs Gill (Reception/Year 1).
- Mrs Dunlop and Mrs Cockman, teaching Year 2, will remain where they are this year.
- Mrs Remington Davidson, teaching Year 6, will be positioned in what is currently the Sailfish Year 4/5 class.
- Mrs Marsh/Mrs Hardy, teaching Year 6, will be positioned in the Activity Hall which will temporarily be converted into a classroom space.

Thank you to those of you, through this year, who have supported Walk to School week and worked with us to promote cycling/scooting and walking to school. We have recently been told that we have achieved Modeshift Bronze Award (for our travel plans) and have won a scooter pod, which will be delivered and fitted in the Autumn term.

Please find attached our list of clubs for the Autumn term. Many of these require places booking with external providers (details attached). Clubs which are organised by in-house staff (e.g. lunchtime sports clubs) do not require parental consent but children will need to sign up for these in September. Details will be on the noticeboard opposite the Year 2 classroom.

Finally, please find attached information on the Reading Challenge (organised by the library service) which Mrs Marsh has recently promoted in assembly. Medals and certificates will be handed out in school.

Have a wonderful Summer, enjoy a rest and some family time. We look forward to welcoming the children back with us on Wednesday 6th September.
