Current School Development Priorities

SEND

- Ensure appropriate statutory procedures are in place for the existing pupils with EHCPs
- Investigate and complete historic outstanding SEND actions for pupils with SEND needs
- Work with parents and staff to implement SEND plans (ADPRs)
- Liaise with external agencies for additional support

Behaviour

- Ensure consistency in behaviour approach across the school
- Implement the Cambridgeshire Therapeutic Thinking principles
- Provide a calm and purposeful learning environment for all

Quality of Education

- Enhance teaching and learning knowledge and skills, including the use of adaptive strategies to meet the needs of all pupils
- Ensure the school curriculum is taught consistently from Early Years to Year 6
- Develop a rigorous whole school assessment system (FFT) to track attainment and progress of all pupils

- What is the purpose of the Governing Body?
- Governors have 3 main roles:
- The strategic Role
- School Improvement
- The accountability of Governing Body

1.The strategic role

- Developing the vision and aims for the school
- Planning so that all pupils can achieve the very best they can

2. School Improvement

- Monitor and evaluate the school's work
- Visit the school
- •Ensure that all meetings are effective by reading all papers prior to the meeting and preparing their questions

3. The accountability role of the Governing Body

- Ensuring the progress of pupils
- Critical friend to the school
- Listening and reporting to parents and wider community

Other responsibilities include;

- Promoting high standards of education and achievement
- Planning the school's long term future
- Appointing senior staff, including the Head Teacher
- Hear the second stage of complaints, grievances and disciplinaries
- Budgetary allocation and control
- Making sure that the curriculum is broad and balanced

What Governors do not

- Take sole responsibility for writing school policies
- Spend lots of time working directly with pupils
- Make judgements on the quality of teaching
- Do the job of the school staff
