Phonics

We have resumed our phonics sessions, some children will be bringing home their books to read with you and others will continue to practise their single letter sounds and two letter one sound cards. Please aim to read/practise sounds with your child 4 times a week and record in their reading record. We do phonics every day in school so please do send in the reading pouch with the reading record inside.

Writing

Drawing club will start next week, we are super excited about this. It is a chance for children to learn to love reading, writing and exploring texts.

Maths

Maths this term will progress from the work we did in autumn term, we will look at 3d shapes, patterns, measure and numbers beyond 10 and number bonds to 10 further developed in provision.

General information:

Outdoor learning

We will continue to utilise the outdoor areas in all weathers, this does mean the children will possibly get wet or dirty so please do send in spare clothes so they can change if this occurs. Also ensure that your child has suitable outdoor clothing for the weather, hats, gloves, a warm waterproof coat and wellies.

PE day

PE days remain the same;

Your children can come dressed in PE kits on these days, please ensure all jewellery is removed on these days and that your child has appropriate footwear- trainers ideally as we may be outside.

Please label ALL of your children's clothing, equipment, items they will bring in to school. It is so important so that we can return any lost/misplaced items to their correct owner!
