What have we been doing this term to improve the opportunities and outcomes for our children?

- Our exciting new reading approach is being delivered across the whole school. Children are extremely positive about this change.
- Our new phonics scheme is being taught consistently across EYFS-Year 2.
- The work to develop our new website is almost complete, with it being due to go live in spring 1.
- All Year 1 children now take part in our daily play-based learning approach. Watching the children learning through play in the courtyard in all weathers is a joy!
- The development of our new Core Purpose (vision) is nearly complete. We look forward to sharing this with you all in the new year.
- Our new arrangements for assemblies mean that every week, children from Yr1-6 take part in cultural enrichment assemblies. Throughout the course of the year, every teacher will deliver one on a personal interest of their choice. This term our topics have include Japanese culture, pantomime dames, Christmas traditions around the world, support dogs and life in Wales.
