Dear Parents/Carers

We had a wonderful time celebrating the coronation of King Charles III on Friday 05th May 2023. Thank you to FOBS for purchasing the strawberries and cream for all children to enjoy.



We are so proud of all our Year 6s after completing their SATs last week. As you may have seen in the media, some of these questions were incredibly hard. It has been sad to learn of the amount of children who found this week highly distressing across the country. Our pupils coped brilliantly, many of them telling us they really enjoyed sitting the papers and doing their very best. This is a testament to the excellent pastoral care we provide and the positive attitudes of our pupils. The SATs breakfasts went down particularly well, thank you to FOBS for funding this. As an extra little treat after the last paper, we also had a pancake party where the children could choose from a range of toppings for their toasted pancake.

The last few weeks have been jam-packed full of exciting learning including the visit of multiple secret story tellers in EYFS. Who will it be next week? In Year 1 this week children have been on a fantastic dinosaur adventure to Knebworth House. In Year 2, the children have been amazing whilst completing their SATs; they have also enjoyed sketching nature outside and hugging trees. Year 3 have had fun erupting their volcanoes and have had a brilliant day making their own bread. They initially designed their own packaging and practiced making bread with Play-Doh before making the bread and had a picnic to evaluate their bread making. Year 4 have been busy planting Sun-flowers and have had 100% success rate, they can't wait to continue to watch them grow, along with the plants that will be growing in our wild flower garden and no-mow zone. Year 5 have evaluated packaging and the quality of biscuits; they will be using their findings to design and make their own biscuits. They have also enjoyed reading Kensuke's Kingdom in whole class reading and exploring the writing techniques used in English.

We recently welcomed all of the teachers from 11 other schools to take part in a writing moderation exercise. This is the first time such an event has taken place in many years and what a pleasure it was to network with staff across so many schools.
