These key areas are currently a source of frustrations for many parents and carers. We completely understand, and that is exactly why we are working hard to drive rapid improvement for these priorities. The small steps that we have very recently introduced have already yield positive impact. For example, we have changed school assemblies from 30 minutes to 15 minutes each day. This slight change has seen pupils displaying more focused, listening and engagement with their morning routines. We know that the impact of this development journey will require some time for our school community to fully appreciate. We can't thank you enough for your continued partnership.
