
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Dear Parents/Carers

School Development

As you will know, we are working hard to put reading at the heart of our curriculum. We want to inspire a love of reading within all of our pupils. As part of this work, every class in school now engages with a daily DEAR session. DEAR stands for Drop Everything And Read and is a protected 15 minutes where everything stops so that the children can listen to an engaging and high quality text read by one of the adults in the classroom.

We are proud of the huge amount of work that had gone on behind the scenes to provide high quality enrichment and pastoral support for pupils. We now offer multiple 1:1 and group workshops, giving pupils the opportunity to engage in wider curriculum activities which build on particular interests or skills they have shown including gardening, construction and outdoor art.

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From after the Easter break, our EYFS children will be visited by a secret storyteller once a week! The mystery adult will read an EYFS friendly book which they themselves love.

Safeguarding

In school, lanyards are used to signal whether an adult has had the necessary checks to be able to work on a 1:1 basis with children.

Red lanyards mean an individual hasn't provided the necessary check and needs to be supervised whilst on site.
