
EYFS News

PE Roundup

Friday 28th November

On Friday 28th November, Bassingbourn took 16 KS2 pupils to Trumpington Park Primary to compete in two friendly matches. Trumpington fielded an A and a B team. To test the resilience and overall quality of our squad, Bassingbourn chose to split into two evenly matched teams rather than selecting an A and B side.

Trumpington A vs Bassingbourn Team 2 (4-3)

This fixture was a true reflection of outstanding team spirit and resilience. Despite playing some excellent football and showing great determination, the boys were unable to overcome the many challenges they faced during the match.

Bassingbourn took an early and deserved lead through a clever goal from Max, which caught the goalkeeper off his line. Unfortunately, a world-class 'body on the line' save from Anamol resulted in our goalkeeper being injured and unable to continue for the remainder of the game. Oscar stepped up bravely to take over in goal and, despite conceding three goals in quick succession, kept Bassingbourn in the game with several excellent saves.

Jake's constant long-range efforts tested the Trumpington keeper, while Jacob chased tirelessly all over the pitch, proving to be a real thorn in the Trumpington midfield. The boys ended the first half 3–1 down.

The second half started with Trumpington scoring early to make it 4–1. From this moment on, the game became a real test of pride and resilience. Despite working himself into some brilliant positions, Andre was unable to find the net, but his never-say-die attitude was outstanding throughout. A unique, powerful throw from Teddy repeatedly pinned Trumpington back in their own half before Chase finally got himself on the scoresheet with an excellent finish to make it 4–2. Chase continued to dominate aerially, winning header after header at both ends of the pitch.

A long-range effort from Max produced the final goal of the game, making it 4–3. Although this was a friendly, the boys displayed exceptional resilience and incredible teamwork. I am incredibly proud of their attitude above all else.

Trumpington B vs Bassingbourn Team 1 (5–10)

Bassingbourn got off to a flying start with an early goal from Harry, who went on to score an outstanding double hat-trick. Despite taking a bump to the head and earning the inevitable AstroTurf burn, he showed great resilience and continued to play with real energy and focus.

Ralph added Bassingbourn's second goal, finishing confidently after some great build-up play. In defence, Rohan was tireless throughout, covering huge distances, making important tackles and delivering accurate passes that helped launch several attacking moves.

Trumpington produced some strong passing moves of their own, but Bassingbourn's defence remained well organised. Harry added another with a firm header, while Jacob worked tirelessly at the back, chasing down attackers and clearing danger whenever required.

Both goalkeepers played an important role in the match. Stanley made several impressive saves with quick reactions, and Finley stepped in for part of the game, showing great courage and capability between the posts.

In a fine show of sportsmanship, Bassingbourn offered to adjust team numbers, although Trumpington chose to continue as they were. Play continued at pace, with Harry scoring directly from a corner and Devon tapping in another goal for Bassingbourn. One further Bassingbourn goal went unnoticed, and the half ended with Bassingbourn leading 8–3.

Early in the second half, Harry added another goal before Trumpington replied with two of their own. Miss Richardson offered timely guidance from the sidelines, helping the boys regain their focus. The team settled quickly, and Harry completed his scoring after a well-placed assist from Jacob.

As the match drew to a close, Jacob made a superb run down the pitch and set up Ralph, who calmly slotted home the final goal of the game to make it 10–5.

This was a brilliant display of teamwork, resilience and sportsmanship from the entire Bassingbourn squad. Every player contributed, every player worked hard, and the support for one another on the pitch was clear to see.

Well done to all involved – you represented the school proudly.
