#### **League Round 4 Match Report**

#### **Haslingfield 2 – 3 Bassingbourn**

Round 4 of the football league saw the unbeaten Bassingbourn side travel to Haslingfield Primary School for a tough away fixture.

The game started slowly, with Bassingbourn struggling to get out of their own half. Sustained pressure from Haslingfield tested the defence early on, but some incredible saves from

goalkeeper Anamol kept the score at 0–0. At the back, Jacob, Lucy, and Max battled relentlessly, producing clearance after clearance to keep Bassingbourn in the contest.

Despite the defensive resilience, Bassingbourn eventually fell behind when a strong initial save was followed up and put away, making it 1–0 to Haslingfield. In the same moment, the goalkeeper was injured, forcing Teddy to step in between the sticks for the final minutes of the half.

That substitution proved crucial. Teddy's very first touch was a vital one, launching a goal kick all the way up the pitch to Harry, who finished brilliantly to level the score at 1–1 right on the stroke of half time.

It was one of the first occasions Bassingbourn had found themselves level after trailing at the break, but the team pulled together and motivated one another ahead of the second half. With Anamol unable to continue, Andre raised his hand to take on the demanding goalkeeper role — a special moment and a true demonstration of natural leadership.

The second half began at pace, with substitutes Joseph, Finley, and chase immediately involved, making important tackles and early touches. A well-worked Haslingfield move soon followed, restoring their lead at 2–1.

The next three minutes proved to be the turning point. Constant motivational words from Max pushed Bassingbourn to raise their intensity and belief. The response was immediate, and with around eight minutes to go, Harry struck to make it 2–2.

The match continued end-to-end, with Jake and Ralph producing big tackles at key moments and Andre making several outstanding saves to keep Bassingbourn in the game. Then came the decisive moment: an excellent corner from Jacob found Harry in the box, who completed his hat-trick to give Bassingbourn a deserved 3–2 lead.

All that remained was to defend the advantage — and the team did so superbly. When the full-time whistle blew, players from both sides shook hands in clear acknowledgment of the effort, resilience, and respect shown throughout the match.

Bassingbourn now look forward to their next fixture after half term.

A special thank you goes to the wonderful Mrs Barnett for fuelling the team with biscuits and ensuring all injuries were handled superbly — the Manchester City physio team would be lucky to have her.

In December, I led an assembly about our community campaign to open up the route over Ivy Farm Bridge as a walking and cycling route between Bassingbourn and Royston. This was a real highlight of my year!

The children were so well-behaved, and they immediately understood the benefits of this active travel route for their future independence, leisure opportunities, education and sustainability. I'll never forget how they all burst into laughter when I showed them my picture of the sheep on the solar farm along the way!

In the letters, the children also showed incredible consideration to the interests of the landowner if public right of way to access the bridge, which is owned by Hertfordshire County Council, can be created.

The letters, along with those from people of all ages in the wider community as well as from Bassingbourn Village College, Icknield Way First School, and the Parish Council, have now been posted to the owner of the Cokenach Estate. We will keep the BCPS community posted about any progress with this community cause.
