Year 4 News

Year Four – A Fantastic Start to Spring Term One

Year Four have made a wonderful start to Spring Term One. Although the first week back has been short and rather chilly, the children returned full of enthusiasm and excitement – especially when we were treated to a surprise snow flurry!

We have begun the term positively by exploring our class artists in greater depth, focusing on the vibrant works of David Hockney and Roy Lichtenstein.

In mathematics, the children have been revisiting their key instant recall facts, concentrating on the 6, 9 and 11 times tables. Much of our work has centred on developing the skills behind multiplication, as we prepare for the upcoming Multiplication Tables Check taking place in June.



In English, we have launched our new writing unit, where the children will be creating a nature journal recount inspired by a fantastic book from Our Tower by Joseph Coelho.

Our first History lesson has also sparked great interest, as we will be learning about the Maya civilisation and exploring the impact this ancient society had on history and the wider world. We were particularly wowed by the excellent connections the children made between our Geography rainforest unit from Autumn 2 and the location of the Maya settlements.



Our new science unit began this week with a focus on states of matter – a particularly fitting topic as we will be investigating melting points and boiling points, among other aspects, over the coming weeks.

The highlight of our first week back has undoubtedly been the skateboarding session. The children engaged brilliantly, showing confidence, resilience and enthusiasm throughout.

We are very much looking forward to a fantastic and progressive Spring term ahead.
