


Music


## Maths


This week we have been exploring fractions and equivalent fractions. We have used manipulatives and drawing out shapes to support the learning of finding fractions of quantities.










# WELL DONE CHILDREN OF BASSINGBOURN PRIMARY SCHOOL YOU RAISED...
