

In this role, Mrs Remington Davidson supports children who have been in previously been care or are currently in care and works with external agencies to support families, who attend Bassingbourn Primary School. She builds a relationship with the children and works with the children's class teachers to ensure they are getting additional support where needed. She also works closely with Miss Gregson, our SENDCO.

In 2025, school will be hosting two community coffee mornings to develop this network of support further, alongside the Virtual School, whose role is to support both schools and families of children who were previously in care or are currently in care.
